

THE VALUES OF A TEAM PLAYER

- The conviction that God has placed us where we are for His pleasure and purpose, and for our well being and destiny
- The conviction that places Christ and His people above all of the team players own desires, ambitions, and opinions. The team member must see the ministry as a way to serve and to give rather than as a way to fulfill or promote self.
- A willingness to accept any assignment necessary to advance the teams overall vision. A team player must reject position-consciousness or an "others should thank me, recognize me, or reward me" attitude. A servant becomes great by making other people successful. Therefore, a team member must come with a servants spirit and a servants heart, having the overall vision of the church in mind and priority.
- A conviction of loyalty that will save the church and the team in a time of testing. This conviction can only be proven where there is disagreement, disappointment, or disillusionment.
- A conviction of faithfulness. The faithful team member understands promotion comes from the Lord and the Lord promotes based on his principles. The principles of faithfulness and integrity are basic to leadership.
- A conviction of availability. Team members see availability as the needed ingredient to being a useful vessel to God, to other leaders and to those being served. Being available requires good discipline of time and priorities.

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
